Troubles have not come singly to T.C. Benoy. He was put under bond to keep the peace for a period of 30 days by Justice Stocker last August. On September 10, on account of his drunkeness and threats against his wife, he was sentenced by Justice Stocker to 15 days in jail and to pay a fine of \$50, and is still confined in jail serving out the sentence and fine.

Now his wife, Rosa Benoy, has brought suit and action against him for divorce, and in her complaint alleges she fears that as soon as the defendant is released from jail he will attempt to kill her unless required by order of the court to remain away from her and not molest her.

For the past two years, the plaintiff stated her husband has been an habitual drunkard, and while under the influence of liquor has been quarrelsome and abusive, and has frequently threatened to take the life of this plaintiff or his own life.

During the past summer she has been compelled to take her boy, now seven years old, and flee from her home and seek the protection of friends on account of his riotous manner and threats.

The plaintiff prays that she be awarded the community property consisting of a house and lot in Carlin's addition with the household goods, and that she be given the custody of the child. The plaintiff is represented by Attorney J.W. Marshall.

Thomas was murdered by his fifth wife Janetta (Jeanetta) at their home in Stites, Idaho. She was sent to prison in Boise, Idaho.

Mrs. Benoy will be sentenced tomorrow by Judge Miles S. Johnson. The law provides for an indeterminate sentence.

The Nezperce community was saddened yesterday when it learned of the death of Mrs.
M.T. Farris, which occurred at the Farris home at 12:30 a.m. yesterday. The deceased had been ill since February of this year and was bedfast during most of that time. Her condition had been critical for the past several weeks and her passing was not unexpected.

The deceased was well known and highly esteemed in the Nezperce community and took an active part in many of the social activities here. Moving here with her family from Camas prairie 12 years ago, they located on the beautiful and fine farm two miles northeast of town and have since made their home there.

Thoroughly a native of central Idaho, Selena Benoy Farris was born at Grangeville, Idaho, On November 16, 1876. She passed away at the Farris home near Nezperce at 12:30

a.m. September 13, 1933, at the age of 56 years, 10 months and three days. She grew to womanhood near Grangeville and was married to Major T. Farris on December 31, 1894, at Mt. Idaho. To this union four children were born. They lived on Camas Prairie until 1921 when they moved to Nezperce.

Besides her husband she is survived by a son, Garlin Farris of Nezperce, and three daughters, Mrs. Harry Wise, and Mrs. Lawrence Sather, Nezperce, and Mrs. Roy Akers, Winona. Also two grandchildren, Delbert and Wanda Akers, Winona, and a sister, Mrs. Coleman Kerlee, Lapwai.

The Rebekah lodge of this city was in charge of the funeral service for the deceased, which was held at one o'clock this afternoon from the Community church here. FUNERAL MONDAY FOR M.T. FARRIS

Pioneer Called Saturday At Lewiston After Long, Active Life

The life of one of central Idaho's outstanding pioneer characters came to an end at 1:05

Saturday morning with the passing of Major T. Farris at St. Joseph's hospital in Lewiston. After enjoying unusually good health throughout his life, he became ill only nine days before with an abdominal disorder and it soon was evident to his attending physicians that there could be little hope for his recovery. All of his children were at his bedside when the end came.

A resident of central Idaho since 1890, Mr. Farris enjoyed and endured all the experiences of the early days of the area, farming and freighting in the South Fork country long before the opening of the Nez Perce reservation. A man of endless energy and vitality, he was never idle and began each task with a vigor that characterized him. In pursuing both his work and pleasure he ranged wide over the central Idaho country gaining a wide acquaintance - few if any of whom could not be counted as his friends. He refused even to let old age handicap his activity and continued to carry on with manual work until his last illness, in spite of the fact that his success in life would have permitted his retirement many years ago. Until 1944 he worked regularly in the harvest season and it was uncommon to find any entertainment within a 50-mile radius at which he was not an enthusiastic participant.

Born in 1868 in Illinois, Mr. Farris heeded the words "Go west" and came to Idaho as a young man locating first at Clearwater. After a few years there he moved to Winona in 1893 and the following year he was married to Selena Benoy of Grangeville. They were successful in farming in that community and reared their four children there. In 1922 they bought the Curtis Miller place two and a half miles northeast of Nezperce where their successful operations continued. Mrs. Farris passed away in 1938. Mr. Farris always took an active interest in community affairs, serving several terms as commissioner of Lewis county. Two years ago he moved to Lewiston where he had since been employed by Bob Wright.

Funeral services were held at two o'clock Monday afternoon at the community church in Nezperce where the building was filled to capacity with old friends who had come to pay their last respects to the deceased. Rev. Harry Slick of Spokane delivered the sermon and beautiful vocal trio numbers were rendered by Leslie Baskett; Mrs. Claude Miller and Miss Louise Miller. Active pallbearers were George Thomas, Joe Luz, Glen Miller, Gay Miller, Joe Stach and Joe Barbee. Honorary pallbearers were G.C. Pennell, S.L. Stapleton, Maurice Younger, W.R. Emerson, Lew Clark and Martin Lux. Local Odd Fellows, of which lodge he was a veteran member, attended in a body. Interment was in the local cemetery.

Surviving the deceased are three daughters and a son. Mrs. Harry Wise and Mrs. Lawrence Sather, Spokane; Mrs. Roy Akers, Portland and Garlin Farris, Nezperce; two sisters, Mrs. Sam McKenzie of Portland and Mrs. Laura Blakely, Walla Walla; five grandchildren and three great-grandchildren.
