

The following facts in regard to Mr. E. W. Robie, whose death we chronicled last week, were received too late for publication in our last issue: E. W. Robie was born in Madison county, N. Y., June 20, 1835, and consequently at the time of his death was nearly fifty-four years of age. He served in the Union army all through the late war, being with Sherman in his march to the sea, in the engineer corps. He came to the Pacific coast in 1870, and resided in this county a good portion of the time since.

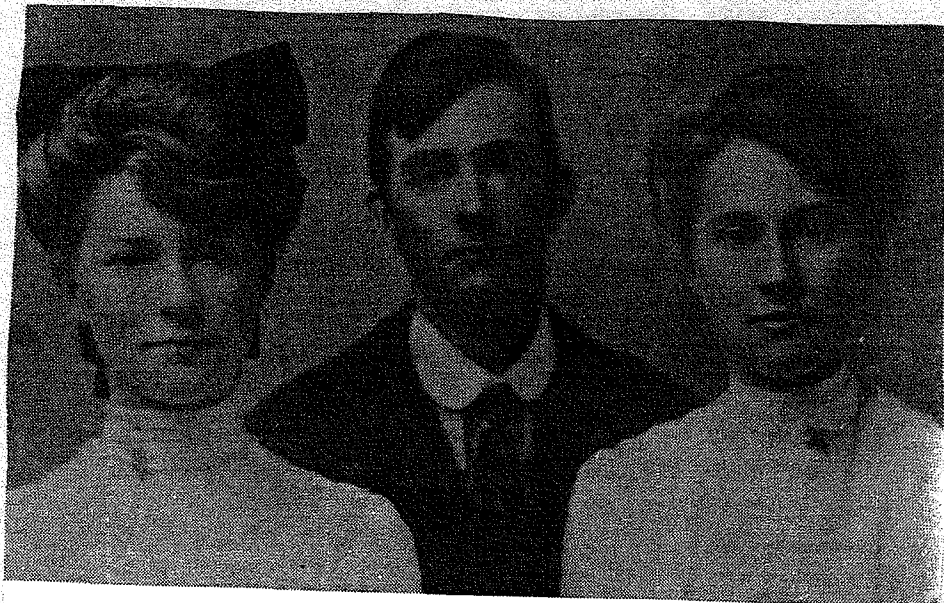
News has just arrived that Mr. Robie is dead. All we can learn at present is that he went from home on horseback, and his horse returned alone, when search was made and he was found dead. This is the third death in Mrs. Robie's house within a few months. She has the sympathies of all on John Day's creek, and doubtless wherever she is known.

The death of Mr. Robie creates a vacancy in the board of county commissioners which the law directs shall be filled by the appointment of a substitute at the succeeding session by the remaining members of the board. J. B. (Bailey) Chamberlain has been solicited by the voters of the third district to be a candidate for the position, but he is ~~not~~ to assume the burden of public life again. Nevertheless, we believe that Bailey is too conscientious and public-spirited not to sacrifice his personal interests to public duty, when called upon by his fellow citizens to do so. His long residence here and knowledge of county affairs gained in official life, and the additional fact that his interests are all in the third district, and that he pays taxes on \$5,500, marks him as well qualified to represent the third district in the board of county fathers, and we hope in due time to chronicle his appointment and acceptance of the position.
